



HENRY FORD AT RICHMOND HILL

In 1925, Henry Ford of Detroit, Michigan, a leading American automobile designer who purchased the majority (the coverage of auto manufacturing) began acquiring large areas of land on both sides of the nearby Ogeechee River. He converted abandoned plantations and forestry operations, creating the recreational area with much-needed employment opportunities for the area's impoverished residents during Reconstruction. The site of the White Bluffs plantation was converted to a hotel, which was operated from 1926 until 1939. In 1939, the site was sold to the local community and is now a part of the Richmond Hill State Park.






