The great horned owl is known as the typical "hoot owl" because of its monotone call. It is the third largest owl species in North America. Juniper and her brother, Cedar, were orphaned after falling from a nest.

Eastern screech owls are small, nocturnal creatures. Both owls came to Callaway Gardens after being struck by vehicles. The accidents resulted in nerve damage and loss of vision on one side, making both owls non-releasable.

Willow Barred owls are named for the distinctive brown and white pattern on their breast feathers. They do not build nests, depending instead on cavities in dead or dying trees. Willow is a human imprint and cannot be released.

The most widely distributed species of owl, this raptor is also known as the white owl, silver owl, demon owl, ghost owl or church owl, references to their appearance, call, habitat and eerie, silent flight. Whisper is unreleasable due to her

These colorful raptors have reddish feathers on the shoulders, chest and underside of the wings, and adults have a conspicuous black-and-white striped tail. Red-shouldered hawks favor wet environments such as river edaes, moist woodlands and swamps. Autumn is a human imprint.

After Cedar and his sister fell from a nest, they were taken to a rehab center and determined to have no injuries. During their short stay, they developed an unnatural association with humans, leaving them un-releasable.

Broad-winged hawks use vocalizations for communication with their mates, offspring and territorial intruders such as red-tailed hawks. Their call sounds like a high-pitched "kee-ee." reminiscent of a whistle. Dauset is a human
