Anne Frank in the World: 1929-1945 uses over 600 photos to tell the story of a young girl growing up in Europe against the backdrop of the events that culminated in World War II and the Holocaust.

The space also includes:

- Daily showings of *The Short Life of Anne Frank* (available in English, Spanish, French, and Hebrew)
- “Witness to the Holocaust: WWII Veteran William Alexander Scott III at Buchenwald” exhibit about a photojournalist from Atlanta
- Replica of Anne Frank's room in-hiding
