Collections and Exhibitions:

As one of a few dozen museums in the U.S. dedicated to the life and career of a single artist the Steffen Thomas Museum of Art (STMA) houses a large collection of sculpture, furniture, paintings, mosaics, watercolors, prints, drawings, and ceramics by Steffen Thomas, who has been designated a "Master Georgia Artist" by the GA Council for the Arts. Thomas's work is used for inspiration for students and families through STMA's Arts Outreach Program. Additionally, STMA maintains a varied and interesting temporary exhibition schedule.

Services:

Location:

The Steffen Thomas Museum of Art is located at 4200 Bethany Rd, Buckhead, GA 30625. STMA is 60 miles east of Atlanta; 5 miles southeast of Madison. From I-20 take Exit 121, turn south on Seven Islands Rd for 2 miles to Stop Sign. Turn right on Bethany Rd for 1 mile to museum, on right. Directional signs are located on I-20 and along the route.

Arts Outreach Program

STMA offers docent training led by a skilled educator. Docents meet each month to discuss various aspects of art, focusing on Steffen Thomas's works, while placing them in the context of art history. Docents take day trips to visit other museums and private collections. Members are welcome to join this stimulating program. Trained docents enable STMA to offer guided tours to groups and school children.

Family Workshops:

One Saturday a month STMA hosts a workshop led by a local artist. Participants tour the museum to view art related to the medium, technique or style used in the hands-on art activity being presented. Young and old alike have a chance to work side-by-side and try something new.

School Programs:

A primary Mission of STMA is to bring art programs to young people in Northeast and Middle Georgia. Many of these indepth, hands-on programs result in a large mural or sculpture, created by students and permantly installed in a public place in their community. Past projects include:

2002 Sundance, mosaic mural by Morgan County Middle and High School Sudents, located at the entrance of the Morgan Memorial Hospital Transitional Care Unit. 2003 Protecting Mother Earth, illustrated poetry anthology by 3rd grade Grennsboro Dreamers, written in support of protecting the earth.

2004 Word Evoking Images, painting by Putnam Middle School students, inspiredby literature, displayed at the Putnam County Board of Education facility. 2005 Music as Muse, ceramic sculpture by Morgan County Middle and High School

students, inspired by music, displayed ay Morgan County High School.

2006-2008 Oceans of Possibilities: Nature, Science and the Visual Arts, a three year program inn support of water conservation.

2006 Two paintings of lakeside scenes by Greene County Middle School students, installed at Old Salem Recreational Area at Lake Oconee.

2007 Painting by Putnam County High School Students, depicting an underwater scene of Lake Oconee, installed at Lawrence Shoals Recreation Area at Lake Oconee. Parallel project by Morgan County Crossroads students, installed at the Lafarge Quarry Nature Trail in Buckhead, Ga.

2008 Painting by Morgan County Elementary and Middle School students, inspired by waterways leading into Lake Oconee, displayed at the Morgan County Aquatics Center. 2008 From Garden Gate to Dinner Plate, a 3-part program including art, gardening and cooking for Morgan County CrossRoads students, who created botanical illustrations, which were used as trail markers at Lafarge Nature Trail and a school herb garden. 2009-2011 Op Art: Opportunities for Employment and Empowerment through the Visual Arts, a three year program introducing students to careers in fields related to the visual arts and

hands-on instruction in creating art projects using recycled materials. 2009 Recycled wire sculture diorama of a lakeside scene by Greene County High School students, installed at Parks Ferry Recreation Area at Lake Oconee. Similar program brought to students at Morgan County CrossRoads School students, who

created a wire sculture scarecrow for their expanded school garden.
