

# Experience the small town appeal of this Georgia city with a *BIG* history.

One of Georgia's top 25 tourist attractions - Chickamauga Battlefield National Park - is only minutes from this namesake city. Downtown Chickamauga looks much like it did in the early 1900s, with unique shops and restaurants. Chickamauga is also surrounded by a breathtaking mountain landscape that invites you to hike, bike, rock climb, canoe and play outdoors.



## What to See

- **Gordon Lee Mansion**  
Tour this 1847 antebellum beauty, used as Union headquarters and as a Confederate hospital during the Battle of Chickamauga. Tours on select summer days and in December; see website for details. 217 Cove Rd., 706-375-4728, [www.gordonleemansion.com](http://www.gordonleemansion.com)
- **Lee and Gordon's Mills**  
Step into another century at this mill, one of the oldest in Georgia. The original mill was built in 1836, burned in 1867 and was rebuilt shortly thereafter. - **Coke Ovens**  
Peer into the beehive ovens that once turned coal into coke for Chattanooga iron and steel foundries. Now a park, with wetland demonstration ponds and a relaxing atmosphere. Just north of downtown Chickamauga on Highway 341, [cityofchickamauga.org/cokeovens](http://cityofchickamauga.org/cokeovens)
- **Crawfish Spring**  
Dip your toes into the ice cold spring water. The source of water for Union and Confederate soldiers during the Battle of Chickamauga, the spring now anchors a lovely park with picnic tables, swings and a gazebo. Parking is free along Cove Rd.

- **Holland-Watson Veterans Memorial Park**  
Take a photo with a Huey helicopter mounted on a pedestal at the walking track. Corner of Crittenden Avenue and W. 8th Street

- **Walker County Regional Heritage/Train Museum**  
Get up close to Civil War and WWI memorabilia, Indian artifacts, antique guns, and a working display of Lionel

- **Chickamauga Turn Train Ride**

## Where to Eat


