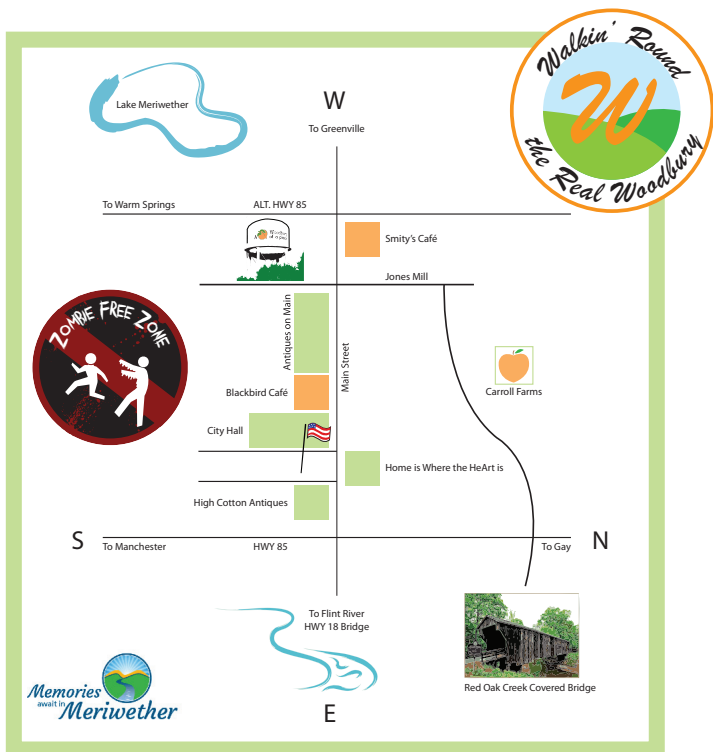

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SITES TO SEE AND PLACES TO PLAY

Carroll Farms – a 4th generation family farm with over 400 acres of peaches... from late May until mid-September and located just 5 miles north of Woodbury. Flint River – Woodbury's public boat launch at Hwy 18 Bridge offers river journeys for picnicking, canoeing, rafting, fishing and camping along a 13 mile trip to Spruell's Bluff or, for the river enthusiast, a 20 mile trip to the 36 Bridge.

Lake Meriwether – Enjoy picnics, boating, fishing and camping at picturesque Lake Meriwether. The 144 acre lake offers bass, bream, catfish and crappie varieties for you and your family. Lake Meriwether Road off Alt Hwy 85 – 706-553-5247

Red Oak Creek Covered Bridge – The Red Oak Creek Covered Bridge was built in the 1840's by freed slave and noted bridge builder Horace King. At 391 feet, including the approaches, this structure is the oldest and longest wood covered bridge in Georgia. Hwy 85N to Covered Bridge Road
